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



# 03 Highlight KEY WORDS/LINES


Not every word on your slide is equally important. Secondly, as presenters, you have to face the challenge of decreasing attention spans of the audience. People quickly scan the slide rather than read word for word. The most important words or lines have to be played up so that they are hard to miss and your key message is conveyed. There are a number of ways to that:

## 3.1 Increase the Font Size

The easiest way to grab attention towards a word is by increasing its font size. The eye naturally will read that first.






# 05 Texture FILL IN THE TEXT

Another cool effect that you can apply to your text is the 'Texture Fill' effect in PowerPoint. Again you can use PowerPoint's default textures or save one of your own and apply the same.

The steps are the same- Select the text box, right click and click **Format Shape**. Select the **Text Options** tab and under the **Text Fill** menu, select the **Picture or texture fill** radio button. Choose the default textures provided by PowerPoint from the **Texture** menu or save one of your own from the web as an image and insert the same by clicking the **File**... button.





# 08 Text OUTLINE ε NO FILL

Make your text look as if written by a stencil. Give it an outline without any text fill. Depending on the font you choose, your slide can look vintage or modern.

Follow these steps - Select the text box, right click and click **Format Shape**. Select the **Text Options** tab and under the **Text Fill** menu, select the **No fill** radio button. From the **Text Outline** menu, select the **Solid line** radio button. Choose the text outline color of your choice and set the width as per your creative judgment.





# 10 Maintain PERFECT SYMMETRY

While in the above hack, the aim was to create disorder, in this hack we will try to achieve the total opposite - Order! We will align the starting and ending letters of each line so that the text looks neat and in place. This hack can be applied for that sleek, professional touch in all types of business presentations.

You can aim for precision by following these steps- Select all the lines, go to the **Format** tab and under the **Align** menu, select **Align Left**. To ensure all lines are aligned on right as well, split the words or adjust the font sizes as was done in the below example too.

### Variation 2: Use Transform

You can also rotate the text using a creative, transform effect available in PowerPoint. You must have thought such an effect was possible only in Photoshop. But it is possible in PowerPoint at the click of a button.

Select the text box, go to the **Format tab**, open **Text Effects**, open **Transform**, and select the option you like:
